When it rains it pours...tomatoes! The plants we started in early March are finally bearing fruit, and a lot of it. In addition to selling cherries, slicers and heirlooms at our farm stand, we're canning tomatoes, simmering tomato sauce, creating a spicy tomato jam, as well as tomato salad...you name it. We're making the most of our other harvest bounty: peppers are turning into jalapeño jelly; zucchini is becoming cream-cheese frosted cupcakes, and our ever-flourishing kale is transformed into crispy chips flavored with an addictive garlic and parmesan seasoning. In addition to our regular hours on Saturdays from 10-3, we're now offering a self-serve option at our stand at 180 Drinkwater Rd on Sundays, and during the evening rush hour on Thursday and Fridays.

What's fresh now: *tomatoes, peppers, scallions, onions, beans, zucchini, summer squash, kale, swiss chard, cabbage, eggplant, fresh herbs, flowers and, of course, our beloved pasture-raised eggs.*
